- 1 What is the issue between referential or truth conditional semantics, and inferential role semantics?
- 2 Does Grice's approach to meaning bypass the notion of a convention, or lead to it, or depend upon it?
- 3 Is externalism in the philosophy of language compatible with first-person authority over what we mean by our words?
- 4 Is meaning a normative notion?
- 5 **Either** (a) Is the probability of a conditional a conditional probability?
Or (b) Are subjunctive conditionals harder to understand philosophically than indicative conditionals?
- 6 Did Russell show that arithmetic is part of logic?
- 7 Discuss any difficulty involved in the logical analysis of belief-ascriptions.
- 8 Has Dummett given us any reason to think that the issue between realism and anti-realism turns on questions of meaning?
- 9 **Either** (a) Is mathematics true by convention?
Or (b) Is logic true by convention?
- 10 Why did Frege reject the idea of basing arithmetic on Hume's principle? Was he right?
