 must also be its makers.' Do you agree?
- 2. In a representative democracy, what should representatives represent?
- 3. 'The people cannot decide until someone decides who are the people.' Discuss.
- 4. EITHER: (a) What, if anything, is wrong with aiming for equality of welfare?
 - OR: (b) Should we be relational egalitarians?
- 5. 'Rawls's difference principle is profoundly inegalitarian. Therefore it should be rejected.' Do you agree?
- 6. 'Liberty of the Subject is consistent with the unlimited power of the Sovereign.' Discuss.
- 7. 'What matters for civic liberty is not who makes the laws, but simply how many laws are made, and thus how many of your actions are in fact constrained.' Discuss.
- 8. Does lack of private property limit personal freedom?
- 9. Is the concept of self-ownership egalitarianism's friend or foe?
- 10. Does distributive egalitarianism illegitimately interfere with individual liberty?
