- 3. Should the interpretation of literary texts be an exception to the usual practice of interpreting words in terms of authorial intention?
- 4. 'The ethical assessment of artworks is always irrelevant to their aesthetic assessment.' Discuss.
- 5. 'What matters aesthetically about a painting or a sonata is just how it looks or sounds.' Discuss.
- 6. Do considerations about aesthetic disagreement count against aesthetic realism?
- 7. What role does imagination play in our engagement with fiction?
- 8. Is an original work of art of greater value than a forgery?
- 9. Defend Plato against the charge that he is a great enemy of art.
- 10. Does Hume's 'Of the Standard of Taste' defend a plausible aesthetic subjectivism?
- 11. According to Kant, how do judgments of beauty differ from ordinary cognitive judgments? Is Kant's analysis convincing?
