For each question do not write more than **2000** words.

1. EITHER: (a) If space is a form of intuition, can it also be a property of things in themselves?

OR: (b) What is the distinction between phenomena and noumena a distinction of?

- 2. 'The *analytical* unity of apperception is only possible under the presupposition of some *synthetic* one.' (KANT) Analyse this claim and explain its significance for Kant's argument in the Transcendental Deduction.
- 3. 'Objective significance is conferred on our representations only insofar as a certain order in their temporal relation is necessary.' (KANT) Explain and assess Kant's argument for this claim in the Second Analogy of Experience.
- 4. EITHER: (a) Is Kant's argument in the Antinomy of Pure Reason successful? Assess with reference to one of the Antinomies.

OR: (b) In what sense, if any, has Kant given a proof of freedom?

- 5. Must Hegel reject materialism?
- 6. 'Sense-certainty itself has thus to be asked: What is the *This*?' (HEGEL) Does sense-certainty have a good answer to Hegel's question?
- 7. EITHER: (a) Examine and evaluate Hegel's use of dialectic in his analysis of 'being' and 'nothingness'.

OR: (b) Examine and evaluate Hegel's use of dialectic in his analysis of 'lord' and 'bondsman'.

- 8. 'Hegel's theory of freedom is intelligible only in the context of his metaphysics.' Discuss.
- 9. 'It is only as an aesthetic phenomenon that existence and the world are eternally justified.' (NIETZSCHE) Discuss.
- 10. Does the genealogy of a belief make a difference to the truth of that belief? Answer with reference to Nietzsche.
- 11. 'The world itself is the will to power and nothing else!' (NIETZSCHE) Is this a metaphysical claim?
- 12. What is the value of moral values? Answer with reference to Nietzsche.
