7 Deadline for handing in Tripos Extended Essays/Dissertations

Students were reminded that the deadline for submitting extended essays via Moodle for Part IB and Part II is **Friday 17 March at 12 noon**. If students miss this deadline without prior approval from the Chair of Examiners, they will be required to instead sit the written exam for this paper (although students should be aware that Friday 17 March is also the deadline for amendments to exam entries. If a student does not submit their extended essays by the deadline, and then does not ask the College to amend their exam entry to sit the written paper, they would then fail that paper).

Students were further reminded that the deadline for submitting dissertations via Moodle for Part II is **Friday 5 May at 12 noon**. If students miss this deadline without prior approval from the Chair of Examiners, students will then fail that paper, as by May 5, the final deadline would have passed for amending exam entries.

*8 Philosophy Tripos Examinations/Marking Criteria in 2023

Faculty Board will be considering any mitigation at its next meeting on 6th March. However, the Chair indicated that exams are likely to contain full content as in previous strike-impacted years. The reason for this is the topics in question could well have been covered in supervisions, and no student should be put in detriment by the removal of a topic. The Chair of Examiners will follow up in writing after Faculty Board has met.

Students were reminded that the Philosophy Faculty uses a numerical marking scheme.

*12 Proposed syllabus changes for Tripos 2023-2024

(*circ*). The teaching staff have subject Caucus meetings in Michaelmas Term each year, to review the syllabus for the following year. Any proposals are then submitted to Faculty Board first, before they are circulated to students, for feedback.

The draft updated Guide to Courses was circulated, showing proposed changes to the syllabus for 2023-24 shown as tracked changes.

Changes shown on the Guide to Courses were approved *in principle* by the Faculty Board on 30th January 2023.

As the Student-Staff Committee had no strong objections, syllabus changes will be implemented from the upcoming academic year, October 2023.

Feedback from students would need to be discussed at the next Faculty Board meeting on 6 March 2023.

*13 <u>Lecture/Logic Class/Seminar (Discussion) Group Questionnaires</u> Students have been encouraged to complete the online

<u>questionnaires</u>. Lecturers/leaders have been asked to remind students, where possible, in their last lecture/group to fill in a feedback questionnaire for the lecture course. The live Open Days will be held on Thursday 6 July and Friday 7 July 2023. Some current undergraduate and postgraduate student helpers will be needed, and information will be sent nearer the time.

17 Green Impact

The Faculty is taking part in the University's environmental accreditation scheme <u>Green Impact</u> after a 3 year hiatus, and is delighted to welcome 4 undergraduate students to its <u>Green Impact team</u>: Izzy Solomon, Dev Penamala, Jess Hawkins, and Mohammed Hassan. Whilst the administrative staff will be focussing on completing the Green Impact workbooks with the aim of achieving a Silver Award this year, the students are initially focussing on their own proposal of a topic-based panel consisting of invited environmental philosophers (internal & external).

*18 Cambridge Period Project

Following the Cambridge Period Project's proposal to the Health and Wellbeing committee in 2020, the General Board's Education Committee officially agreed "to recommend to Faculties and Departments that they provide menstrual products in University buildings." This will ensure inclusivity and access to period products when they are needed most, as well as reduce the stigma associated with periods.

MMLL and Philosophy are taking part in this project to provide free period products in some locations in the Raised Faculty Building. Currently there are free-vend units in the 2nd floor women's toilet and in the 1st floor men's toilet, as we don't have gender-neutral toilets. Products are also available in the library well-being collection. It would be helpful if student reps could share this information with students.

*19 Any other business

The postgraduate rep asked how students might be able to help support striking members of staff and it was noted students are able to join picket lines as a way of showing support if they so choose.

The MPhil Course Director asked the student reps and student guest for their opinions on whether they found in-person or online college interviews to be preferable. The general consensus was that the option of choosing, depending on personal circumstances and character, was preferable as a number of factors came into play for each individual. Specific points included:

- It is less intimidating and less stressful to be able to prepare and be interviewed in known, comfortable surroundings. There is less pressure for those who have anxiety speaking face-to-face.
- Technical issues can be unsettling or may impact a prospective student negatively.

- An in-person format can be very enjoyable and means applicants get to meet other prospective students and experience the university environment which can be very affirming.
- Not all prospective students have a calm home environment in which they can prepare or carry out an interview online without disruption.
- Not all schools have the space to offer prospective students a quiet, focussed environment for an online interview.

The Chair encouraged student reps to also raise issues between meetings, particularly if time is potentially an issue.
