#### **Minutes**

- 1. Alexander Bird chaired the meeting.
- 2. Starring of items was invited.
- 3. The minutes of the meeting held on 11 May 2021 were circulated and approved.
- 4. There were no matters arising from the minutes not raised elsewhere on the agenda.

#### 5. Student-Staff Committee

- a) A short outline of the way the Student-Staff Committee functions was circulated for information, and any questions.
- b) Year Delegates on the Student-Staff Committee
  Volunteers were sought from all Parts of the Tripos and the MPhil and PhD
  programmes to be a representative for their year group at Student-Staff Committee, a
  different function from the elected Faculty Board Representatives. There were no
  volunteers. In practice not all students would wish to attend all meetings but it was
  hoped/expected that at least two delegates from each year would regularly attend.

## 6. <u>Election of Student Representatives</u>

The Chair highlighted that elections for student representatives on the Philosophy Faculty Board would be held from 12 November to 18 November 2021 with the closing of nominations a week earlier on 9 November 2021. Results would be announced centrally on 19 November 2021.

Thanks were offered to the student representatives for their hard work and support during a complicated year. An undergraduate rep observed that students had become more aware of the presence of their student reps over the past 12 months, in part due to their input into exam arrangements.

## 7. Teaching Arrangements 2021-22

### 8. Lecture handouts

#### 9. Lecture questionnaires

Online questionnaires would once again be used to compile teaching feedback during the year. Lecturers would be asked to remind students, where possible, in their last lecture to fill in a feedback questionnaire for the lecture course. Students would also be encouraged to complete questionnaires for Discussion Groups and Logic Classes. Alexander Bird encouraged the student reps to highlight the questionnaires to their peers and reminded them that the results are discussed by the Faculty.

Action point: Student reps are asked to mention the questionnaires in their communications with students.

### 10. Exam arrangements

In summary all papers would be five hours, online and open book, with the exception of the three papers below that would be closed book and in person:

- •Part II Paper 5 (Philosophy in the Long Middle Ages)
- •Part II Paper 7 (Mathematical Logic)

Arif Ahmed confirmed he would attend all SSC meetings during the year to discuss exam arrangements. Patrick Pan reported that communication of exam arrangements had been very clear and students have a good understanding.

## 11. Tripos Final degree classification

The University has moved to an overall degree classification with **effect for students who matriculated in Michaelmas 2020**. This move was to address a concern that the previous process - whereby students received a class for each year but not an overall class for their degree - was often not understood by potential employers or admitting bodies of other Universities.

The algorithm for obtaining the final classification for the Philosophy Tripos is Part I A (0%), Part IB (30%) Part II (70%). Assessment marks from the first year do not contribute to the overall class. The second year will be weighted at 30% and the third year will be weighted at 70%.

Emails to  $1^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  year students would follow, and additional information would be included in the <u>Guide to Courses</u>.

It was reported that the model chosen by the University was inline with the preference of Philosophy undergraduate students when surveyed before Faculty Board in 2019.

Patrick Pan reported that some students, especially those selecting borrowed papers, had mentioned they might have chosen different paper options had they known about the 70:30 split.

Alex Oliver felt it would be feasible to change paper options and that it should be possible for any paper. Alexander Bird confirmed this should be communicated to both students and DoSs.

#### 14. Extended Essays in Part IB/Extended Essays and Dissertations in Part II

Students were reminded that the deadline for submitting extended essay and dissertation titles is 12:00 noon on Friday 19th November 2021.

All titles have to be approved by the Chair of Examiners before the end of Michaelmas Term, on 3rd December 2021.

Students were also asked to note that any student who does not submit their Extended Essay on time, would have no option but to sit the corresponding exam paper. Any student who does not submit their dissertation on time would effectively fail the paper, as the deadline for submitting dissertations is after the final deadline for amending exam entries.
