Overview of Panopto to record and publish teaching material

Panopto is a system that has two distinct functions. First, it enables you to directly record lectures or presentations using video (or audio-only for podcasts). Second, it enables you to publish a recording onto our online resources, either a recording you have made with Panopto, or a recording you have made another way e.g. with Zoom.

Once you are logged into Panopto with your Raven credentials, your recordings will be stored in an area in the Panopto system called My Folder. The My Folder area is private to each user and enables recordings to be uploaded, stored, reviewed and edited in a private space before being made available to students in the Philosophy Undergraduate Moodle course pages which are accessible here: <https://www.vle.cam.ac.uk/course/view.php?id=95302>
Any recordings stored in your My Folder area can be published at any time to the relevant undergraduate Moodle course pages above by using Panopto as outlined in step 2. below.

The following provides details on the different ways in which Panopto can be accessed and used.

1. **Panopto desktop recording and publishing on your own computer:** Panopto desktop recorder can be downloaded and installed on your local computer to make recordings. The recordings can be reviewed and edited on My Folder before publishing to the relevant Moodle course. To download/install Panopto desktop, create and review recordings, and publish recordings to Moodle, see the relevant section below. In addition to Panopto desktop recording '**Panopto Capture**' is available which allows users to record their video, audio, screen and applications directly within an internet browser rather than downloading the desktop software. - a. **Download and install Panopto desktop recorder:** to access the Panopto download your Moodle account will need to be synchronized to Panopto by visiting the Moodle course page below at least once. After logging into Moodle a 'Fetching content' message should briefly display in the Panopto block located at the top of the right hand column. Your account should now be synchronized and you can log out of Moodle: <https://www.vle.cam.ac.uk/course/view.php?id=202861>

To download Panopto software from the *CambridgeMoodle* site, visit the web page: <https://cambridgelectures.cloud.panopto.eu/Panopto/Pages/Home.aspx> Click on 'Sign in', enter your Raven credentials then click on 'Download Panopto' (green icon top right hand side of the screen). Save the installation file to your Downloads folder and double click on it from there to install the software.

- b. **Create a recording using Panopto:** remember to use the 'Sign In' button in Panopto desktop, recordings will then be uploaded to the 'My Folder' area by default. Video and audio-only recordings can be made by selecting the required sources in Panopto (**Note:** to record audio-only, select 'None' for the 'Video' primary source and leave the 'Audio source selected as 'Microphone'). Before uploading Panopto desktop recordings to the My Folder area, the system initially stores recordings to a local folder on your computer called 'Panopto Recordings' in the 'Movies' folder. This local folder destination can be changed by selecting the 'Panopto' menu (top left of screen from within the Panopto desktop application) then 'Preferences' and 'Browse' to another folder. The next time Panopto desktop is launched local recordings will be stored in the new folder.

- c. **Review and edit recordings using Panopto desktop:** remember to use the 'Sign In' button in Panopto desktop, to review recordings in the My Folder area. Recordings can be reviewed and edited in the private My Folder space before being published to a Moodle course. Access your recordings stored in My Folder via the 'Manage Online', 'Edit' or 'View Online' links in Panopto desktop application, and then select 'My Folder' in the left hand menu to view your recordings. The options for editing are very limited. You can fairly easily remove footage but you can't add any. You can't e.g. edit together footage from multiple takes. If you do remove anything from the middle of a recording, remember that at this point the recording might look jarring and, if you were moving around, you may appear to teleport. Recordings will often end with a few moments of you fiddling around with closing the powerpoint, etc. so it may be best to chop off the last few seconds.

- d. **Publish a recording to a Moodle course:** when the Philosophy Moodle courses are available, recordings can be published to the relevant course by following the steps outlined here: <https://www.vle.cam.ac.uk/mod/page/view.php?id=13191751>

Note: to set a publication date and expiry date for the recording, scroll down the 'Overview' screen mentioned in point 3. on the above help page and set the dates/times as desired in the 'Availability' section.

2. **Record with Zoom and upload to Panopto:** video and audio-only recordings can be created using Zoom and uploaded to Panopto for publication to Moodle courses. To record audio only in Zoom click on the 'Stop video' button in the menu bar. For more information about recording with Zoom see the user guides here: <https://www.phil.cam.ac.uk/aboutus/IT>




Download an audio MP4 only version from a Panopto video recording:

It is possible to download an MP4 audio only recording from a video in Panopto and then re-upload it (e.g. to Panopto). See section 2. 'Download Audio as MP4' on the following Panopto help page: <https://support.panopto.com/s/article/How-to-Download-Video-or-Audio-Streams-as-MP4s>

3. **Uploading lecture handouts to Moodle courses:** login to Moodle and navigate to the relevant year and paper number on the Moodle site. For all the editing options below ‘Turn editing on’ via the cog wheel available in the green header section of the Moodle page:



Locate the ‘Lecture Handouts’ section and add a subsection for your course by clicking on the ‘Add subsection’ link (circled in red in at foot of screenshot below). A subsection labelled ‘Topic *n*’ will be added to the outer Lecture Handouts section. Rename the subsection by clicking on the pen icon (circled below) and inputting your **course name together with the year and term (e.g. MT2021)** then hit the return button on the keyboard (note: if you do not hit the return button the label name will return to the default ‘Topic *n*’ default).




Once the subsection has been created drag and drop files (or a number of files) from your computer to your course subsection. **Note:** it is recommended that file names uploaded include the year, paper number and course name so that they are easily identified by students.


Collapse/Expand sections

To ensure that the Moodle course pages display in an orderly and uniform way it is recommended that subsections are collapsed after adding content to them. To collapse a subsection click on the downward arrow head on the left of the subsection label. To expand the subsection click on the plus sign to the left of the label as circled in the example below.




Restrict Access to handouts from or until a specified date/time

To restrict access to handouts from or until a specified date/time, click on the small blue cog wheel directly above the name of your course subsection (see screenshot below).

- 4. Adding weblinks to Moodle Live Online Teaching Links:** login to Moodle and navigate to the relevant year and paper number on the Moodle site. Locate the 'Live Online Teaching Links' section on the Moodle page. For all the editing options below 'Turn editing on' via the cog wheel available in the green header section of the Moodle page.

Add a subsection to the Live Online Teaching Links for your course by clicking on the 'Add subsection' link (circled in red in screenshot below). A subsection labelled 'Topic *n*' will be added to the outer section. Rename the subsection by clicking on the pen icon (circled below) and inputting your **course name together with the year and term (e.g. MT2021)** then hit the

return button on the keyboard (note: if you do not hit the return button the label name will return to the default 'Topic n' default).

5. Quickmail on Moodle

Quickmail enables teachers to send an email message to all students enrolled on a particular paper number (or to selected students, individuals or group/roles).

To send an email to all students on a particular course/paper number, select 'Student (Role)' from the 'Who should receive this message' drop down list (see screenshot below). Repeat this for any other role categories that need to receive the message. Recipients can also be excluded by selecting the relevant role or individual from the 'Who should NOT receive this message?' drop down list.

Hover over the relevant recording to reveal a sub menu and click on the 'Share' button (see screenshot below).

Zoom: Please note Zoom recordings shared via the web portal will only be stored for 90 days after which time they will be automatically deleted in order to free up space in the School's Zoom Cloud storage. If you wish to keep a permanent copy of the recording, click on the 'More' button and download the file to your local Downloads folder. Locally stored recordings can then be uploaded and shared using Panopto as described in sections 2. and 7. above.

After recording your Zoom session, login into the Zoom web portal: <https://zoom.us/signin> Click on 'Recordings' in the left-hand menu then the 'Share' button to the right of the relevant recording (see screenshots below). On the next screen click on 'Copy Sharing Information' to copy the link text to the clipboard which can then be pasted into an email and made available to users who are not enrolled on Moodle courses.

Please note Zoom recordings accessed via the web portal above **are not stored permanently** and may be removed after a month in order to free up space in the School's Zoom Cloud account. If you wish to keep a permanent copy of the recording, click on the 'More' button and download the file to your local Downloads folder. Locally stored recordings can then be uploaded and shared using Panopto as described in sections 2. and 7. above.
