- 1. EITHER: (a) Why is consent morally important, if it is?
 - OR: (b) In the complex world we live in, can we expect people to be informed enough to give meaningful informed consent?
- 2. In a society without an explicit practice of promising, could one still make a promise?
- 3. 'Virtue theory gives us no straightforward advice on what to do in any given situation, so it is useless as a theory of normative ethics.' Is this a fair challenge?
- 4. Is virtue theory fatally undermined by the thought that there are many different ways in which a human being might flourish?
- 5. 'Internalism about reasons may represent a sad truth about people we just have to learn to live with.' Discuss.

- 9. Is morality like mathematics? Answer drawing on AT LEAST ONE Early Modern philosopher.
- Why ground morality on such a narrow basis as human sentiment? Answer drawing on AT LEAST ONE Early Modern philosopher.
