- 1. 'A person goes by a signpost only in so far as there is an established usage, a custom.' (WITTGENSTEIN) Discuss.
- 2. Should Wittgenstein admit Augustine got anything right about language?
- 3. 'If someone were to draw a sharp boundary, I could not acknowledge it as the one that I too always wanted to draw, or had drawn in my mind. For I did not want to draw one at all.' (WITTGENSTEIN) Discuss.
- 4. What connection is there (if any) between reference and reidentification?
- 5. What if anything is 'inner' about your 'inner life'?
- 6. 'The changes in Wittgenstein's philosophy in the 1930s were prompted by the colour exclusion problem.' Discuss.
- 7. Is 'I' a referring term sometimes, always or never?
- 8. 'The performance of an illocutionary act involves the securing of uptake.' (AUSTIN) Does it?

- 11. Does Anscombe offer us a plausible interpretation of what is meant in saying that the conclusion of a practical syllogism is an action?
