- 4 'We have obligations only to beings that exist. Future people do not exist. So we have no obligations to future people.' Discuss.
- 5 **Either** (a) Can the nature of an end, by itself, give us good reasons to promote it?
 - **Or** (b) What is the connection between what I want and what I have a reason to do?
- 6 Can we distinguish the intended from the merely foreseen consequences of an action? Is the distinction morally significant?
- 7 Does the *Nicomachean Ethics* give us any useful guidance on which character traits are moral virtues?
- 8 Is Aristotle able to explain how we can be responsible for our moral character?
- 9 Is the distinction between bringing something about and allowing it to happen morally significant?
- 10 'I should act on principle, but thinking that I am acting on principle should not be part of my motive for acting.' Discuss.
