- 1 'If we can account for representation in naturalistic terms, then there is no philosophical problem of consciousness.' Discuss.
- 2 **Either** (*a*) If truths need facts to make them true, how can Presentists say anything true about the past?
 - **Or** (b) If our present time is the only temporal location that exists, should we treat our present location as the only spatial location that exists?
- 3 Is imagination more important in understanding other people than in understanding any other item in the world?
- 4 **Either** (a) Is 'I' a referring term? If so, what does it refer to?
 - **Or** (b) 'The subject does not belong to the world but it is a limit of the world.' Discuss.
- 5 **Either** (*a*) How, according to the *Tractatus*, do I succeed in expressing that a certain state of affairs (atomic fact) occurs?
 - **Or** (b) What are the objects of the *Tractatus*?
- 6 What are the methodological difficulties in debates about realism?
- 7 In what sense, if any, are there alternative conceptual schemes? If they exist, does their existence have important implications?
- 8 'Sceptical doubts about the material world should not be answered but cured.' Discuss.
- 9 Is causal realism established by the fact that we can observe causal connections? Or by the fact that without them the order of nature would be a miracle?
- 10 'Scientists can do good science in ignorance of the history of science but philosophers cannot do good philosophy without knowledge of the history of philosophy.' Discuss.
- 11 Is there a clear distinction between universals and particulars?
- 12 Must a cause necessitate its effects?
