- 1. 'The World is the totality of facts, not of things.' Discuss
- 2. What are the objects of the *Tractatus*?
- 3. What does 'I' refer to?
- 4. If we can follow rules, why cannot the private linguist?
- 5. 'To say that a proposition is whatever can be true or false amounts to saying: we call something a proposition when *in our language* we apply the calculus of truth functions to it.' Discuss
- 6. 'Is it superstition to think I *see* the horse galloping in the picture? And does my visual impression gallop too?' Is it and does it?
- 'If you know a mathematical proposition, that's not to say you yet know anything'. Why not? OR

Are mathematical statements expressions of conventions?

- 8. Why must a mathematical proof be perspicuous?
- 9. "It is not a kind of seeing on our part; it is our *acting* which lies at the bottom of the language game". Why is this important to Wittgenstein?
- 10. Why did Wittgenstein want to deny that Moore knows what he says he does?
