- Are there any good arguments for Davidson's view that there are no alternative conceptual schemes?
- 2 How should we characterise realism, and how should we assess it?
- 3 **Either** (a) How are we to understand the relationship between a thing and its properties?
  - **Or** (b) What in the world makes universal generalisations true?
- 4 Do material objects have temporal parts?
- 5 Must causes precede their effects?
- 6 **Either** (a) Are statements about the future now either determinately true or determinately false? If not, what are we to say about them?
  - **Or** (b) 'We can move more freely in space than we can in time.' Discuss.
- 7 'Knowledge is not closed under known implication, but sceptical arguments presuppose that it is.' Discuss.
- 8 'The history of philosophy is a branch of philosophy.' Do you agree?
- 9 Can we give a satisfactory account of personal identity without reference to the body?
- \*10 Explain and evaluate Wittgenstein's argument in the *Tractatus* that objects are simple.
- \*11 'Here we see that solipsism strictly carried out coincides with pure realism. The I in solipsism shrinks to an extensionless point and there remains the reality coordinated with it' (WITTGENSTEIN, *Tractatus*, 5.64). Discuss.
