- 2 What has the transcendental unity of apperception got to do with the Kantian categories?
- 3 'Kant's distinction between appearances and things in themselves is fundamentally a distinction between two kinds of properties of things: relational and intrinsic.' Discuss.
- 4 Do Kant's Antinomies demonstrate the truth of transcendental idealism?
- 5 Is Hegel's absolute idealism superior to subjective idealism?
- 6 Is Hegel right to think that self-consciousness can be correctly understood only by reference to desire?

- 12 Does Nietzsche have a convincing account of asceticism?
