- 1. Is there a good argument for the right to exclude would-be immigrants?
- 2. Who should bear the burdens of preventing catastrophic climate change?
- 3. Is rape a political issue?
- 4. 'The only plausible feminisms are intersectional feminisms.' Discuss.
- 5. EITHER: (a) Which should be of greater concern to feminists: gendered divisions of labour, or gendered norms of appearance?

OR: (b) Which should be of greater concern to feminists: the exploitation of women's bodies, or the silencing of women's voices?

- 6. If minority groups refuse to send their children to school, should the state force them to?
- 7. EITHER: (a) 'To know what justice demands, we should examine the concrete realities of existing social practices, not the abstract fantasies sketched behind some "veil of ignorance".' Discuss.

OR: (b) Should we be ideal theorists?

- 8. 'The Marxist theory of alienation might have been relevant to Victorian factory work, but it has no relevance to contemporary capitalism.' Discuss.
- 9. Do Marxists have a plausible explanation of why workers fail to revolt against capitalism?
- 10. 'Power, not justice, should lie at the centre of our political theory.' Discuss?
