Membership

Any current members of the University and academic visitors with a University Card may borrow from the Library.

Accessibility

There is a lift to the Library from the 3rd floor of the Faculty of Philosophy. You will need to use the main entrance to the Raised Faculty Building to access a lift from the ground floor. Please press the call button outside the Library door for admittance.

Staff are happy to fetch books and to assist you in using the Library. Please ask us. Scanning and photocopying services and height-adjustable desks are available in the Library.

Borrowing & Returning Books Borrowing books

Books can be borrowed from the library desk or by using the self-service machine. Undergraduates can borrow up to 10 books for 7 days in the first instance. Graduates, staff and academic visitors can borrow up to 20 books for 28 days in the first instance.

Renewing books

Books will automatically renew for current undergraduates, postgraduates and university staff. We can also manually renew books on request and you can also renew them online by logging into your library account using iDiscover. Please note short loan and recalled items can not usually be renewed and should be returned by the due date.

Returning books

You can return books at the library desk or by using the self-service machine. You can also return them using the book drop next to Lady Mitchell Hall when the Library is closed. There is another drop box near the English Faculty building which you can use at any time.

Recalling a book

You can recall books which are on loan by logging into iDiscover. The person who has the book will receive an email asking them to return it within 3 working days. You will receive an email when the book is returned and will have 2 working days to collect it. Please contact us if you can't return or collect books within those times and we will do our best to help.

Fines

Fines may be charged at £1 per day for overdue short loan items and overdue recalled items.
