- 1. Does geometry confirm Kant's transcendental idealism?
- 2. EITHER (a) What is experience according to Kant?
 - OR (b) 'Everything that happens...presupposes something upon which it follows according to a rule.' (KANT). Discuss.
- 3. 'The transcendental dialectic...can never bring it about that transcendental illusion...should ever disappear and cease to be an illusion (KANT).' Discuss.
- 4. Critically assess Kant's analysis of freedom in the Antimonies.
- 5. 'The very idea of a "non-metaphysical" Hegel is absurd.' Discuss.
- 6. What is Hegel's purpose in the Sense-Certainty chapter of the *Phenomenology*? Does he succeed?
- 7. Is Hegel right to think that self-consciousness requires recognition?
- 8. EITHER (a) Assess Hegel's critique of the arbitrary will (*Willkür*).
 - OR (b) 'The abstract concept of the idea of the will is in general the free will which wills the free Will.' (Hegel). What does this mean? Is it plausible?
- 9. Does Nietzsche's view of the nature and significance of tragedy imply a pessimistic view of life?
- 10. What, according to Nietzsche, is wrong with the ascetic ideal? Is he right?
- 11. 'Nietzsche is more of a psychologist than a philosopher.' Discuss.
- 12. 'There is *only* a perspectival seeing, *only* a perspectival "knowing" (Nietzsche). Is this true? How do you know?
