- 1. Explain and assess Wittgenstein's claim that a proposition is a *logical* picture.
- 2. Does the *Tractatus* contain an adequate account of generality?
- 3. What kind of solipsism (if any) does the *Tractatus* endorse?
- 4. Is there any significant difference between semantic and ethical nonsense? Does it matter?
- 5. Does the *Tractatus* prove, or the *Investigations* disprove, the claim that there are simple objects?
- 6. 'It is interesting to compare the diversity of the tools of language... with what logicians have said about the structure of language. (This includes the author of the *Tractatus Logico-Philosophicus*).' (*PI* §23) Discuss.
- 7. Does *Philosophical Investigations* improve upon the conception of philosophical activity that we find at the end of the *Tractatus*?
- 8. 'How can a rule teach me what I have to do at *this* point' (*PI* §198). How can it?
- 9. Explain Wittgenstein's distinction between criteria and symptoms. Why is it important?
- 10. 'If you tried to doubt everything you would not get as far as doubting anything. The game of doubting itself presupposes certainty.' (On Certainty, §115) Discuss.
- 11. How can a hinge proposition be contingent?
